You can donate to your local animal shelter.

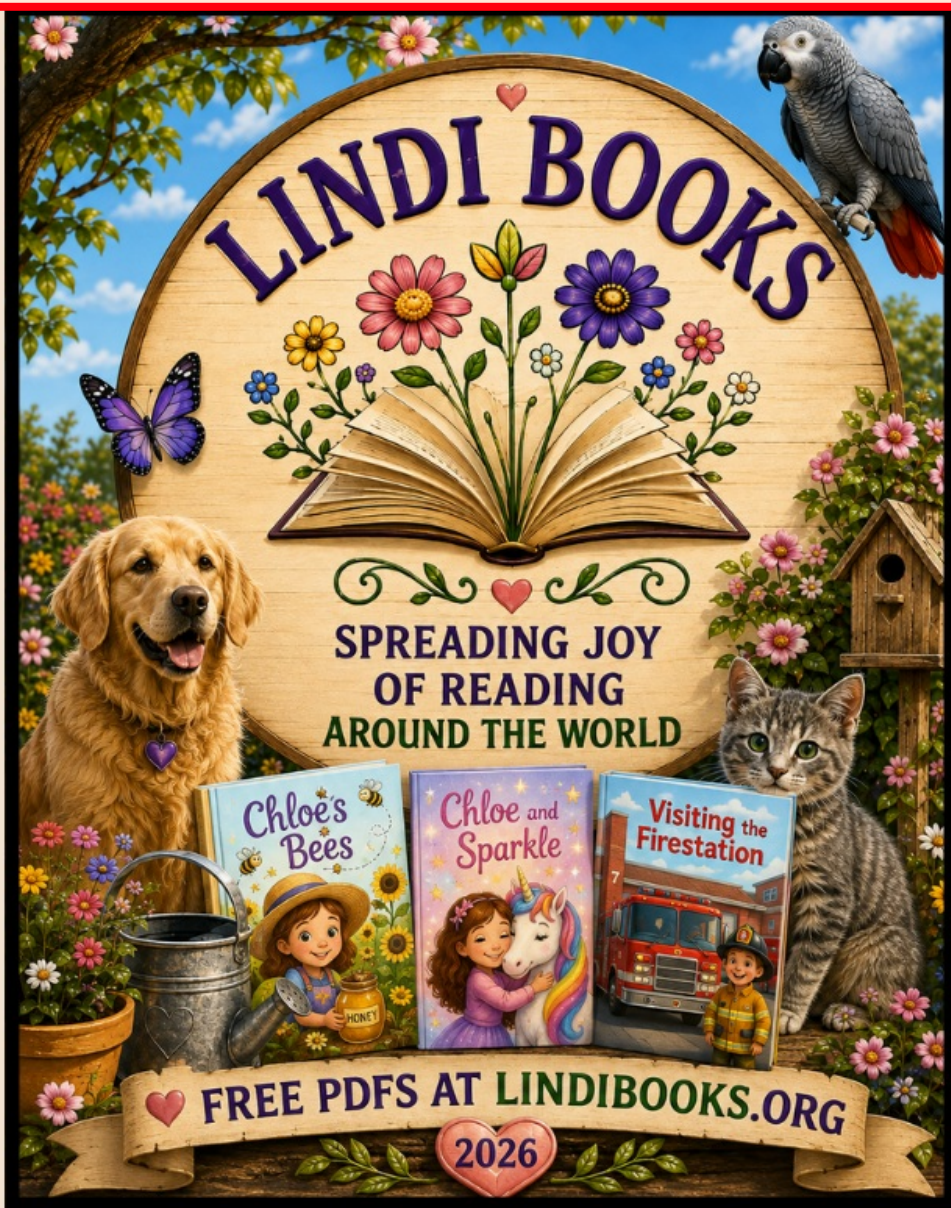
Shelters may need:
